Sue's creativity is well known to those who have had the privilege of working with her over the years.

Her first career was as an art teacher in the Boston area, then after moving to San Francisco she launched her own graphic design studio. Sue was also the founder and director of the Youth in Arts Italian Street Painting Festival, held annually in San Rafael. Last year Sue was honored with a Milley Award for creative achievement from the Mill Valley Art Commission.

Like so many of our volunteers, her path started on the Stepping Out runway when she modeled in 2002. She had attended the event before she modeled and was impressed with To Celebrate Life because, "it was actually doing something," she says. "While others were dedicated to finding a cure, this organization was making a difference now. This was much more personal to me." Sue volunteered in 2003 when she and Kathy Niggeman were in charge of finding escorts for the fashion show. They recruited celebrities and local media personalities, as well as doctors, to accompany the models in the formal scenes. Sue also served on the Foundation's board for two years, lending her talents to the Communications Committee which she continues to co-chair along with Kim Wimer and Lanny Udell.

Because of her personal experience with breast cancer and the deep connection she made with the Foundation through Stepping Out, Victoria has been an involved volunteer ever since. A clinical psychologist specializing in trauma and chemical dependency, she has been in private practice in Kentfield for over 20 years. She is also clinical director of Serenity Knolls, a residential chemical dependency treatment facility in Forest Knolls, where she has been a staff member for 19 years. "I've never been inclined to volunteer, since I am stingy with my time, but To Celebrate Life Breast Cancer Foundation has changed everything," says Victoria.

When Judie accepted the invitation to be a model for Stepping Out, she had no idea the impact this experience would make on her life. Giving back was never a question for Judie. She volunteered the next year to work on the fashion show and, "I discovered a group of



amazing women who shared the common bond of helping others going through their battle with cancer," says Judie. "I was hooked." A Realtor with Alain Pinel in Greenbrae, Judie lives in San Rafael with her husband, Hal. They have two grown daughters.

From their San Rafael kitchens, Meals of Marin prepares and delivers

appetizing, healthy, home-cooked meals to Marin residents with breast cancer and other life threatening illnesses. The meals are delivered free of charge to those who qualify. Currently, they deliver up to two meals a day to 160 clients. During 2011, MOM served over 100,000 meals, prepared by 500 volunteers, bringing the total of meals served to over



1.1 million since they started cooking, more than 18 years ago. "Each meal is served with a large dose of love, caring, comfort and hope," says executive director Carola Dietrick. "Facing a critical illness is scary, but it doesn't have to be as daunting when you know that you will be cared for and are not all alone."
